Abstract Formatting and Styling Recommendations

Recommended Font for the **Abstract text** is Times New Roman. Line spacing should be **Single**. The text should be in one column. The page size should be A4 and 2 mm size should be set for top, bottom, left and right margins. The text should follow the following structure: title, author(s) name(s) and surname(s), affiliation(s), abstract, keywords, acknowledgements (optional), references (optional), figures (optional).

Title: number of words should not be more than 18. Font for the title should be Calibri, all caps and bold; size should be 16 pt. Place the text in the center. Avoid using abbreviations.

Author(s) name(s) and affiliation(s): indicate the first name(s), last name(s), institution(s) name(s), city name, country name and e-mail address. Present the authors' affiliation below their names. Indicate all affiliations with numbers after the author's name with *Italic*. Use font Calibri, size 14 pt for the author(s) name(s) and 11 pt for the affiliation(s). Place the text in the center.

Abstract: expected abstract size is not less than 150 words. Font size should be 12 pt.

Keywords: recommended number of keywords is 6. Font size should be 12 pt. Use initial capital letter for the first word only.

Figures: resolution of the figure should be not less than 300 dpi. Figure(s) should be submitted in the text with .jpg, tiff, .bmp or .gif file extensions. Make sure that texts are readable on the figures. Figure caption(s) should be placed below the figure(s). Mark figure captions as **Fig.1.**, use **(Fig.1)** in the text.

References: the font size of the reference list should be 12pt. Use number(s) in square brackets [2], [5,8], [1,2,5] in the text and in the reference list. Number the reference list in sequences in which they appear in the text.
